### Coaching

- One member of each team's coaching staff needs to complete the ASAA Coach Information Course.
- One school staff member needs to take *Coaching School Sport:*Redefining Winning (cost of \$53 to be paid by the school). Please ensure the person puts the name of their school when filling in the registration.
- Every coach from every team needs to take *Making Head Way* by registration deadline for the respective sport. Any version of this course is acceptable.
- One team official on every team must complete the *Safe Sport Training* online course prior to the team's first game.

<u>Here is a step-by-step guide</u> for how to take each course. In order to register, a coach will need to have an NCCP number and your team will need to meet the above requirements.

## **Beyond Boundaries: Women in Sport**

On <u>National Women and Girls in Sport Day, Wednesday, February 7th,</u> <u>2024</u>, the ASAA hosted its first annual Beyond Boundaries: Women in Sport Workshop & Luncheon to celebrate and acknowledge the hard work and dedication female coaches have given to student athletes across the Province. The workshop was a huge success, with 95 teachers and coaches from across the Province in attendance. The attendees left this event feeling supported, acknowledged, and inspired to continue making a difference in their respective schools and teams.

Led by ASAA Executive Committee member, Dawn-Marie Hunter Sharp and her ASAA Women in Sport planning committee, the Women in Sport Workshop & Luncheon is a stepping stone to guide the ASAA in developing a full conference for women who volunteer in high school sport: coaches, officials, and administrators. The workshop focused on:

- Solution based round table discussions (focus may be athlete, coach, AD, etc.)
- Implementation of research to guide strategies to support and recruit more women into coaching
- Acknowledging the leaders within the women in sport community, and enhancing opportunities for relationships within the community.

This event included stakeholders such as: female coaches working with high school teams, academics working in the field of female coaching/sport



administration, high school athletic directors, and others. The vision for this event in following years is to build a much larger event that will move around Alberta, thereby opening the door for women across the province to meet and collaborate to reduce barriers in female sport participation in Alberta High Schools.
